Royal Rangers chartering has been affected by the Covid-19 virus as most organizations have during 2020 and is reflected in the charter numbers. Listed below, for comparison, are the charter numbers for the charter periods 2018-2019, 2019-2020 and the current numbers for 2020-2021, as of November 3, 2020.

2018-2019 51 Charters 1425 Total boys and leaders chartered

2019-2020 42 Charters 1103 Total boys and leaders chartered

2020-2021 12 Charters 368 Total boys and leaders chartered (This number will grow as this charter period runs from September 1, 2020 to August 31, 2021.)

National Updates

National FCF unveiled new Membership & Advancements guidelines for boys. The revised criterion is merit skills based, as well as stepping back the advancement level minimum requirements. These modifications will allow greater opportunity and encourage more boys in becoming members of FCF; an important processes in the mentoring of these young lives.

Pathfinder Missions efforts and opportunities were in the process for everyone to get involved, including FCF and non-FCF leaders and boys, as well as, non-Royal Rangers. Unfortunately the current situation with the pandemic has halted all efforts at this time, but we eagerly look forward with great expectation as we see what God has for us and how we can serve Him in this capacity as we continue to plan future missions endeavors.

Committee Progress:

We have been busy building our database for tracking the status of staff paperwork being up-to-date. As you know, and as you can see on our web links, we require that all of our RR leaders have been properly vetted by certified background checks and character references. (Know your leadership corp - check in on them from time to time... unannounced. Know the safety protocols and put them into practice.) Each year as outposts resume their activities the church leadership must make sure of every adult leader's fitness to work with children. We are perfecting our records so that when we have events and gather that we can easily verify each leader's status. This process is ongoing in that, children's workers and RR leaders change from year to year.

We want to remind all of the pastors and outpost coordinators the importance of background checks on all adults who will be working with the minors in our churches. When asked.... 'Was there "due diligence" in the matter of protecting the minor?' Let's all be sure we can answer that correctly. Be safe, be vigilant!

<u>Due diligence definition</u>, reasonable care and caution exercised by a person who is buying, selling, giving professional advice, etc., especially as required by law to protect against incurring liability: The court said there was due diligence on the part of the plaintiff.

Most of the churches in the city haven't been meeting with Rangers due to the restriction of attendance. Jun. 2020 – Aug. 2020

In Qtr. 4, all Sectional events were postponed or canceled due to the Covid-19 shutdowns. We conducted our Sectional Staff meeting in August. At that time we decided to cancel all Sectional events for the fall. We also decided to continue conducting Roundtables to keep contact with the Outposts in the section. Three Outposts reported conducting meetings (merit work) during the summer (two in-person – outdoors and one on-line)

Sep. 2020 – Oct. 2020

In September we held a Zoom Roundtable meeting. It was attended by 9 commanders, representing five (5) outposts. We discussed the cancellation of fall events. We discussed ideas on conducting on-line meetings and keeping in contact with our Rangers. Several outposts spoke about conducting in-person meetings in the fall.

During these tough times, we are excited to report startup of a new Outpost in the Section. True Light Church – Southold has started Royal Rangers. The Sectional staff did a presentation in November 2018 for the pastor and several men at the church. The church was in process of changing locations and was not able to begin at that time. Mike Oliver came to a Ranger Basics training class in October 2019. Now they are starting with Discovery Rangers. Please join me in welcoming them to the New York District.

In an informal survey of the 14 active outposts in the section: 6 meeting in-person, 4 meeting online and 4 on hold.

<u>Hudson Valley Section</u> Bill Leman

The churches in the HVS continue to be under some form of lock down. As of the middle of October none of the outposts have been meeting in person. At this time many of the outposts are continuing to meet via ZOOM or Google Meet. It is noteworthy that even these online meetings have seen a dramatic drop off in attendance from last year. Some of the outposts have had day events (BBQs and various simple low contact events like kite flying.) Nathan Pandolfo from Outpost 125 has earned his GMA and the Outpost had a Zoom meeting to honor him. There are two more boys, both from Outpost 60, who are completing the requirements for their GMAs - Elijah Mery and Billy Wittenhagen. It's been difficult, but we are pressing forward and praying for a breakthrough.

Capitol Section Ian Traynor, Sr. Commander Outpost 257 Bethel AG, Rotterdam

Here in Outpost #257 we are continuing our Ranger meetings for all 4 groups. Ranger Kids, Discovery, Adventure, and Expedition. We have just completed Archery merits and BB Gun along with Firearm Safety. We are looking to have an outpost hiking event in the next couple of weeks.

We do have a smaller group of boys this year due to several reasons. Covid is one of those reasons. Our church here, Bethel, is temporarily doing online bible study Wednesday nights due to Covid (used to have study right in church) and at the same time we used to do Rangers in the same building. That allowed parents to drop off their kids to Rangers and go to the bible study. We now have Rangers being held Thursday nights at our old church building. Leaders wear masks and have boys' temp checked and hands are washed on arrival. Commander Dave Hallenbeck and myself are preparing for a GMA ceremony for April 2021 for our three Expedition boys. Something I've never done before and could use all the help I can get. I am reaching out to our pastor and others from church to help us prepare for this ceremony.

Lake Shore Section Kevin Cudney

Due to Covid restrictions, our outposts have not been active. One of our chartered outposts began following the national webinar programs, but those stopped after a month. Another outpost began conducting small worship meetings on Zoom, but attendance quickly declined.

The goal for my local outpost was to conduct a Bicycle Rally for families. This would involve a "Bicycle Rodeo Course" (designed and set up by our AR/ER), Bicycle Inspection Station (provided by a local bike shop), Bike Riding Info Station, and a10 mile ride. But due to continued Covid closures this event has been postponed.

Central Section George Mehallow

Currently we have two outposts running meetings. Grace AG (Outpost 21) was suspended in March. In July, they had a summer session and resumed regular meetings in September. Word of life AG is holding virtual meetings. Trinity AG has suspended Wednesday night meetings (including youth.)
